

Pencerah Nusantara deploys teams of young health professionals to peripheral areas in Indonesia to strengthen primary healthcare services, including in the area of nutrition.

Pencerah Nusantara was deployed to Cirebon regency in 2016-2019. Collaborating with local puskesmas, they identified problems by implementing Social Cognitive Theory (SCT) to improve the rate of breastfeeding in the area.



This study shows the effectiveness of SCT approach where the awards to mothers who have successfully completed exclusive breastfeeding acts as the reinforcing component.



The multisectoral involvement acts as contributing factor in increasing the coverage of exclusive breastfeeding at Puskesmas Losari.



RECOMENDATION
